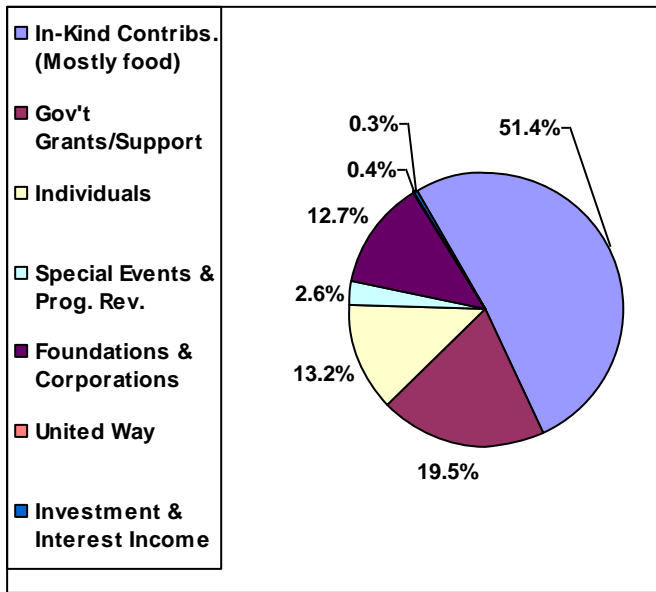

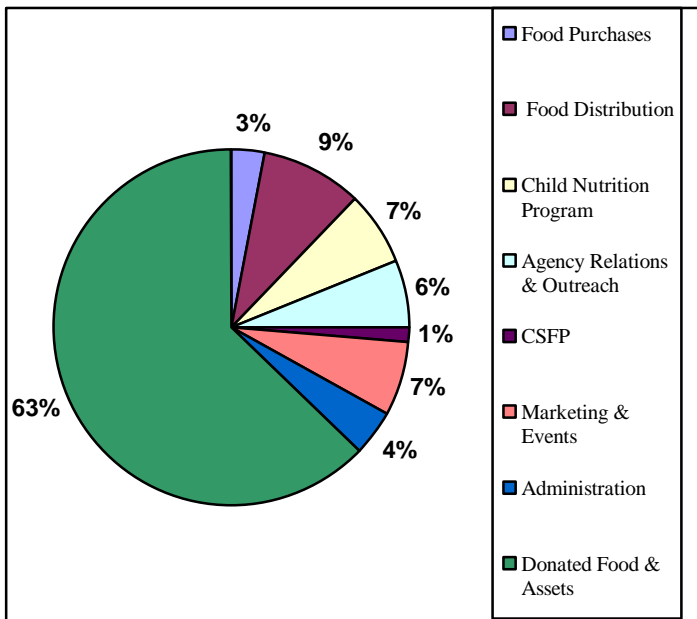

2007-2008 Year at-a-Glance:

Our Service Numbers

- Last Fiscal Year, the Food Bank provided:
- 173,211 school-year and 67,939 summer meals through Kids Cafe
 - 25,432 monthly Commodity Supplemental Food Program boxes to 2,855 individuals, 96% of whom were seniors, equating to ~1 million meals
 - 2.5 million meals to 80,326 unduplicated individuals through member emergency food pantries, shelters, youth and child care programs, rehabilitation services, senior programs, and organizations serving victims of domestic violence
 - 10,838 backpacks/43,352 meals to homeless children through Back-pack Kids
 - 2,231 Food Stamp applications were submitted on behalf of individuals/families; 1638 received benefits
 - Nutrition education to 17,568 individuals and families
 - 185,658 pounds to clients through Mobile Pantry
 - 2,462 volunteers serving 12,226 hours (nearly 6 FTE)
