Become a SWAP Pantry: Supporting Wellness at Pantries

Curious about how to promote nutrition without judgment? The SWAP (Supporting Wellness at Pantries) model uses a red-yellow-green ranking system to highlight more nutritious food choices while preserving client dignity and choice. This session will walk you through how SWAP works and what it takes to get started. Participating pantries will be onboarded to the program, receive implementation materials, and be supported throughout the process. To be eligible, pantries must offer some level of choice (e.g., clients select foods or use a modified selection system) and agree to provide occasional feedback to FBNN.
